

Uses of Quōminus

1. Summary of Use

- 1.1. **Quōminus** is used with verbs of **hindering** and **refusing**, and initiates a subjunctive verb
- 1.2. **Quōminus** is literally equivalent to **ut eō minus**

2. Exempla

- 2.1. Poverty does not prevent us from speaking: **nōn egestās impedit quōminus fēmur**
- 2.2. Poverty does not prevent us from speaking: **nōn egestās impedit ut eō minus fēmur**
- 2.3. Nothing hinders us from being able to do that: **nihil impedit quōminus id facere possīmus**
- 2.4. Nothing hinders us from being able to do that: **nihil impedit ut eō minus id facere possīmus**
