

Verbs Taking the Dative (p2/many)

1. Verbs that Command, Obey, Serve, Yield, Resist, Threaten, Pardon or Spare
 - 1.1. He spares and pardons me: **mihi parcit atque ignōscit.**
 - 1.2. Excuse a father's grief: **ignōsce patriō dolōrī.**
 - 1.3. I will spare no labor: **nōn parcam operae.**
 - 1.4. They resisted Caesar for three days: **trēs diēs Caesarī adversī sunt.**
 - 1.5. Let us resist the king: **rēgī resistāmus!**
 - 1.6. I will yield only to Cato: **solum Catonī cēdam.**
 - 1.7. You obeyed the laws: **legibus pārūistis.**
 - 1.8. He was commanding the soldiers: **militibus imperābat.**
 - 1.9. I ordered the battle lines: **aciēbus temperābō.**
 - 1.10. She abstained from cookies: **crustulis temperāvit.**
 - 1.11. Some exceptions--**iubeō**, order, takes an accusative
 - 1.12. **Cēdo** may also take the preposition **in** + acc., where it means 'to come to' or 'turn into'
 - 1.13. **Temperō**, where it means 'to abstain from,' may take the dative, or the preposition **ab** + abl.
2. **Indulgeō, indulgēre, indulsī, indultum**, yield, allow, favor, indulge, be addicted to
 - 2.1. This verb fits several categories and has irregular principal parts—review carefully!
 - 2.2. He indulged in the new liberties: **novīs libertātibus indulsit.**
 - 2.3. I permitted the shouting: **clamōribus indulsī.**
 - 2.4. They are forced to yield to the storm: **tempestātī indulgēre eīs necesse est.**

 - 3.1. **parcō, parcere, pepercī, parsum**: to spare
 - 3.2. **ignōscō, ignōscere, ignōvī, ignōtum**: to forgive
 - 3.3. **adversor, adversārī, adversātus sum**: to oppose, resist, withstand
 - 3.4. **resistō, resistere, restitī (no passive)**: to oppose, resist, withstand
 - 3.5. **cēdō, cēdere, cessī, cessum**: to cede, give in, yield to, give way for
 - 3.6. **pāreō, pārēre, pārūī, pārītum**: to obey, submit
 - 3.7. **imperō, imperāre, imperāvī, imperātum**: to comman, rule, demand, impose
 - 3.8. **temperō, temperāre, temperāvī, temperātum**: to moderate, temper, order, govern, manage, control, combine, abstain from
 - 3.9. **indulgeō, indulgēre, indulsī, indultum**, to yield, allow, favor, indulge, be addicted to
